PASADENA MUNICIPAL BAND

The Pasadena Municipal Band was formed in the summer of 1975 by citizens of Pasadena who recognized a need for a community band. Since its inception, the PMB has continued to perform throughout the Pasadena and Houston metroplex, and the Southeast portion of Texas. The current mayor of Pasadena, The Honorable John Ray Harrison, was one of the founders of the band.

The PMB is comprised of approximately fifty members and rehearses one evening per week throughout the concert season, September thru July. Performances number between 15 to 20 per year at various functions, gatherings or concert sites. For the past year, the PMB has performed at ceremonies on the Battleship Texas.

The PMB is open to all adults who desire to continue their band experiences of high school or college. The rehearsal and performance atmosphere is designed to challenge all participants yet allow the thrill and enjoyment of performing in a concert band. The band is sponsored by the City of Pasadena and operates from the Parks and Recreation Department. Each of the PMB's concerts cover the complete spectrum of band music; from marches, musicals and popular selections to pieces written for concert band, popular orchestral transcriptions and featured soloists.

Robert Zwick is Associate Professor of Music and Director of Bands and joined the Houston Baptist University School of Music in Fall, 1981. He is a graduate of Eastern Kentucky University (BME) and North Texas State University (MME), (PhD). Dr. Zwick is a member of the College Band Directors National Association, Texas Music Directors Association, Texas Bandmasters Association, National Association of Jazz Educators, Music Educators National Conference, Association of Concert Bands, Christian Instrumental Directors Association, Phi Mu Alpha Sinfonia, Pi Kappa Lambda, and Local 65-American Federation of Musicians. His performance organizations at Houston Baptist University include Symphonic Band, Jazz Band, and the Husky Band. Dr. Zwick has also been Music Director for the Pasadena Municipal Band since 1976, and plays trumpet professionally in the Houston area. He frequently clinics and judges local Jr. High and Sr. High bands, and is available through the School of Music.
